# **Biographical Sketch**

**Gary Gereffi** is Emeritus Professor of Sociology and Founding Director of the Global Value Chains Center at Duke University (https://gvcc.duke.edu/). He received his B.A. degree from the University of Notre Dame and his M.Phil. and Ph.D. degrees from Yale University. He was also awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Economics and Management from the University of Padova, Italy on March 13, 2023. Gereffi has published over a dozen books and numerous articles on globalization, global supply chains, and economic, social. and environmental upgrading, and he is an originator of the Global Value Chains (GVC) framework. Recent books include: *China's New Development Strategies: Upgrading from Above and from Below in Global Value Chains* (G. Gereffi, P. Bamber, and K. Fernandez-Stark, eds.), Palgrave Macmillan, Sept. 2022; *Handbook on Global Value Chains* (S. Ponte, G. Gereffi, and G. Raj-Reichert, eds.), Edward Elgar Publishing, 2019; *Global Value Chains and Development: Redefining the Contours of 21<sup>st</sup> Century Capitalism* (G. Gereffi), Cambridge University Press, 2018; and <u>Global Value Chains in</u> *a Postcrisis World: A Development Perspective* (O. Cattaneo, G. Gereffi, and C. Staritz, eds.), The World Bank, 2010.
